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Jen Doulul eo an Joñoulruo Rijilōk ro

Iaar kālōt ñan kōnono kōn aorōk eo an *kōṇaan*. Ij kōjatdikdik bwe kōjwōj kajjojo naaj pukōt ilo buruwōd ñan kālōt eo jej lukkuun kōnaan im ekōjkan ad joñi kōnaan ko ad raorōk tata.

Kōnaan ko rej ba kōttōpar ko ad imaan tata, kōttōpar ko imaan tata rej lōme kālōt ko ad, im kālōt ko rej kwałok mākūtküt ko ad. Kōnaan ko jej jebali rej kwałok ekōjkan ad oktak, ta eo jej tōpare, im ta eo je erom.

M̄oktata Ij kōnono kōn jet iaan kōnaan ko rej juōn wōt. Āinwōt armej ewōr jet aikuj ko an kanniōk. Kōnaan ko ñan kaju būruwōn aikuj kein rej kiel jet iaan kālōt ko ad im kwałok jerbal ko ad. Jilu waanjoñak ko renaaj kwałok ekōjkan ad jet iien ellā ioon kōnaan kein kōn bar kōnaan ko me rej lōm̄nak elaplōk an aorōk.

Juōn, mōñā. Ewōr ad aikuj ko kōn mōñā, bōtaab ium̄win juōn iien kōnaan in emaroñ in lee ioon jen juōn kōnaan ekajoorłok ñan jitłok.

Ruo, jikin kone. Āinwōt juōn laddik 12-iiō-dettan Iaar jum̄ae juōn kōnaan ñan jikin kone kōnke kōnaan eo aō elaplōk ñan kakūrmool men ko aikuj an Boy Scout ñan jołok juōn boñ ilo wōjke ko. Iaar juōn iaan laddik ro me raar ilçk jān eem̄ nuknuk ko rem̄şan im pukōt juōn wāween ñan kalōk juōn jikin kone im kōm̄şane juōn jikin babu jān men ko kōm maroñ kar loi.

Jilu, kiki. Meñe kōnaan in imaan tata emaroñ in kar ilo jidik wōt iien lee ioon jān juōn kōnaan aorōk lók. Āinwōt juōn ritariñae edik ilo Utah National Guard, Iaar katak juōn waanjoñak kōn menin jān juōn opija emeļeļe kōn tariñae.

Ilo allōñ ko imaan in Pata eo ilo Korea, juōn jarin tariñae jān Richfield Utah National Guard kar kūr ñan etal ñan jerbal. Jarin tariñae in, tōl jān Captain Ray Cox, ewōr ie enañin 40 em̄şan in Mormon ro ie. Ālkin jet bar kaminene im kapenłok jān ijōko jet, eaar jab etto raar jilkinłok er ñan Korea, ijo raar eñjake jet iaan tariñae ko renana an pata jab eo. Ilo juōn pata raar ko jān kakkure an buki rikōjdat ro, kain likorkor rōt in joñan eaar kakkure jarin tariñae ko jet.

Ekōjkan an menin jelet kōṇaan eo ñan kiki? Ilo juōn boñōn eo ekamijak, ke jarin tariṇae eo an rikōjdat raar jodik itumāan im itulik in eria eo kar bōke jān ritariṇae ro, Captain eo eaar kōmṁan bwe talboon eo en ilq̄k ñan eem̄ nuknuk eo an im jiroñ ro rej lale jikin eo ñan kūr l̄q̄k e kajjojo awa ko aolepen boñōn eo. Menin eaar dāpij an ritariṇae ro kiki, bōtaab eaar barāinwōt kameļeļe bwe Captain Cox en pen an kiki. “Ekōjkan am̄ kar kōmṁane men eo?” Iaar kajjitōk ippān. Uwaak eo an ej kwaļok kajoor kōn ɣee ioon kōṇaan.

“Iaar jelā bwe eļaññe kōm naaj kar rool ñan ijo jikim, Inaaj kar ioon ro jinen im jemen laddik ro ilo iaļ ko ilo jikin jidikkid eo am, im Iaar jab kōṇaan jelmae jabdewōt iaer eļaññe laddik eo nejier eaar jab rool ñan m̄weo im̄ōn kōnke kōn jabdewōt men Iaar likjab ñan kōmṁane āinwōt juōn ritōl.”¹

Juōn waanjoñak ekajoor kōn ɣee ioon kōṇaan kōn kōttōpar ko im̄āan tata im kōn m̄akūtkūt ko! Ej juōn waanjoñak ekajoor ñan kōj aolep ro rej bōk eddo in jeramṁan eo an ro jet— ro jinen im jemen, ritōl ro an Kabuñ in, im rūkaki ro!

Āinwōt juōn jemļok ñan bwebwenato in, ilo jibboñ tata in boñōn eo eaar jab kiki ie, Captain Cox eaar tōl em̄maan ro an ilo juōn jodik ippān jarin tariṇae ro an rikōjdat ro. Raar bōk 800 rikalbuuj ro im kar ikinejnej wōt ruo iaer. Cox kar nōbare kōn peran, im jarin tariṇae eo an raar bōk Presidential Unit Citation kōn buñbuñ eo aer eļap. Im āinwōt ritariṇae ro an Helamōn (lale Alma 57:25–26), aolep raar rool ñan im̄we im̄wier.²

Bok in Mormon epād ie elōñ katak ko kōn aorōk eo an kōṇaan.

Ālkin elōñ awa ko in akwelāp ippān Irooj, kar jiroñ Enos bwe jerawiwi ko an em̄ōj meļokļoki. Innām eaar “jino eñjake juon ikdelel ñan jeramṁan eo [an] ro jein im jatin” (Enos 1:9). Eaar je: “Im … ālkin ke iaar jar im jerbal kōn aolep kijejetō, Irooj Eaar ba ñan eō: Inaaj lewōj ñan eok ekkar ñan kōṇaan ko am̄, kōnke tōmak eo am̄” (eoon 12). Kememej jilu aorōk ko me rej kwaļok kōjeramṁan ko kar kalim̄mur kaki: kōṇaan, jerbal, im tōmak.

Ilo kwaļok eo an kōn tōmak, Alma ej katakin bwe tōmak emaroñ jino kōn “maroñ jab bar [juōn] kōṇaan tōmak” eļaññe jenaaj “kōtļok bwe kōṇaan in ej jerbal ilo [kōj]” (Alma 32:27).

Bar juōn katak eļap kōn kōṇaan, eļaptata kōn ta eo ej aikuj in ad kōṇaan eļaptata, ej waļok ilo eñjake eo an kiiñ eo an riLamanite ke kar katakin jān mijenede eo Aaron. Ke katak eo an Aaron kar kareele, kiiñ eo eaar kajjitōk “Ta inaaj kōmṁane bwe in maroñ lotak ilo Anij” im bōk mour indeeo?” (Alma 22:15). Aaron eaar uwaak, “Eļaññe kwōj kōṇaan men in, … eļaññe kwonaaj ukweļok jān aolep jerawiwi ko am̄, im naaj buñ padik im̄āan Anij, im kūr ioon Etan ilo tōmak, im tōmak bwe kwonaaj bōk, innām kwonaaj bōk kōjatdikdik eo kwōj kōṇaan” (eoon 16).

Kiiñ eo eaar kōm̄māne āindein im ilo jar ekajoor eaar kwałok, “Inaaj julok aolep jerawiwi ko aō ñan jelā Kwe … im mour ilo raan eo āliktata” (eoon 18). Kōn kalim̄mur in im bwe kile eo an kōñaan eo an eļaptata, jar eo an eaar uwaak ilo kabwilōnlōn.

Rikanaan Alma eaar wōr juōn an kōñaan ñan kwałok ukwelok ñan aolep armej, bōtaab eaar jelā bwe ejjab aikuj in kōñaan kajoor in kareel eo menin enaaj kar aikuji kōnke, eaar kōjemłöke, “juon Anij ejimwe … letok ñan armej ekkar ñan aer kōñaan, meñe ej ñan mej ak ñan mour” (Alma 29:4). Ejjełok oktak, ilo juōn mädenłok raan kein Irooj ej kwałok bwe Enaaj ekajet ekkar ñan jerbal ko aer, ekkar ñan kōñaan eo an būruwier (lale D&C 137:9).

Jej ke lukkuun pojak ñan bōk Ekajet Indeo eo ad ñan liküt elōn melele ko ñan ta eo jej lukkuun kōñaan?

Elōn eoon ko rej kōnono kōn ta eo jej kōñaan ilo melele ko kōn ta eo jej pukōte. Irooj eaar ba eo ej pukōt E imaan tata enaaj lo E im ejjamin naaj melokłöke (lale D&C 88:83). Irooj eaar kaiñ kōj ñan kanooj pukōt menin letok ko rem̄man tata (lale D&C 46:8). “[Eo] ej niknik ilo pukōt naaj lo” (1 Nipai 10:19). Irooj eaar ba bwe ełaññe komij epaake ɬok E, Enaaj epaake waj kom; pukōt E ilo niknik im kom naaj lo E; kajjitōk, im kom naaj bōke; kōlōllał im enaaj pełłok ñan kōm (lale D&C 88:63).

Bar karōk kōñaan ko ad ñan lełok ijo eaorōk tata ñan men ko an indeeo ejjab pidodo. Em̄oj ad aolep kapo ñan kōñaan ko emen an men ko an lañin, buñbuñ, utiej bōro, im kajoor. Jemaroñ kōñaan men kein, bōtaab jej aikuj jab kōm̄māni āinwōt kōttōpar ko ad ilōn tata.

Ro me kōñaan eo aer ilōn tata ej bwe en lōn mweien ej wōtlök ilo kapo an mweiuk ko. Rej likjab ñan roñjake kakkōl eo: “Kwōn jab kappukot mweie ko ak men ko re waan an lał in” (Alma 39:14; lale barāinwōt Jekab 2:18).

Ro otemjej rej kōñaan melele ak kajoor rej aikuj ɬoor waanjoñak eo an Kapen eo esperan Moronai, eo jerbal in jipañ eo an ekar jab “kappukot kajoor”, ak jab kōn “kappukot uteej an lał” (Alma 60:36).

Ekōjkan ad kōlapłok kōñaan? Jet renabaj bōk kain kōrraat eo me eaar kōm̄weiur Aron Ralston,³ bōtaab eñjake eo an ej letok juōn katak eo eaorōk kōn kōlapłok kōñaan ko. Ke Ralston eaar etetal aitok ilo kōtaan toł ko rettolök ilo Southern Utah, juōn dekā 800 baun (360 kg) eaar jidimikij an wōtlök im ure pein tuanbwijmaroñ. Ium̄win ɬalem raan ko eaar make ɬok apañ ñan lom̄qorōn e make. Ke eaar jino ebbwer im bōk mej, eaar wōr juōn an ettōñak kōn juōn ɬaddik 3 iiō dettan ej ettōrlök ñan e im kibwij tuanmiñ in pein. Melele menin ej juōn ettōñak kōn ɬaddik eo nejin ilju im jekłaj im juōn jelā bwe emaroñ mour wōt, Ralston eaar pikūr kōloon im kar bōk juōn jerbal eo ñan lom̄qorōn mour eo an mokta jān an kajoor eo an maat. Eaar ruje ruo dii ko ilo pā eo anm̄oonępād

ium̄win dekā eo innām kōjerbal bakbōk eo an ilo nien kein jerbal eo an ñan mwijit pein. Innām eaar pikūr kōloon ñan etetal 5 m̄ail ko (8 km) ñan jipañ.⁴ Juon waanjoñak kōn kajoor kōn juon kōnaan etōr jān joñan! Ñe ewōr ippād juon visiōn kōn ta eo jej erom, kōnaan eo ad im kajoor eo ad ñan jerbal ekajoor an ɬapłok.

Elōn iaad rejjamin jelmae juōn jorrāān ɬapłap, bōtaab kōjwōj aolep jej jelmae aujiid ko men renaaj dāpij eddōkłok ñan mejān kajjik eo indeeo. Elaññe kōnaan ko ad rejimwe rekajoor, renaaj kōm̄weir kōj ñan mwijiti im ɬome kōj make ñan kadeor kōj jān añurlep ko im kajoor in jerawiwi ko jet im kōttōpar ko ejjełok tokjāer me rej dāpij eddōkłok eo ad indeeo.

Jej aikuj in kememej bwe kōnaan ko rejimwe rejjab maroñ in pejpej, m̄okaj kilaan, ak ekadu kitien. Rej aikuj in m̄ool, jab pere, im aitok kitien. Lukkuun kōm̄weur, jenaaj pukōt jekjek eo kōmeleleik jān Rikanaan Joseph Smith, ijo jaar “anjo ioon nana ko an [mour ko ad] im jerwaane aolep kōnaan ñan jerawiwi.”⁵ Menin ej juon jokālōt an juon make. Āinwōt an Eltōr Neil A. Maxwell kar ba:

“Ñe armej ro rej kōmeleleik āinwōt ‘jako kōnaan eo aer ñan jerawiwi,’ ej er, im er wōt, me kōn un raar kālōt ñan jołok kōnaan ko rebōd kōn m̄oñōñō ñan ‘jołok aolep jerawiwi ko [aer] ñan jełā kōn Anij.’”

“Kōn menin, ta eo wōnmaanłok wōt in kōnaan, ilo iien ko, ej ta eo jenaaj ăliktata erom im ta eo jenaaj bōk ilo mour eo ejjełok jemłokin.”⁶

Āinwōt an aorōk wōt julok aolep kōnaan ñan jerawiwi, mour indeeo ej aikuj ɬapłok. Ñan bōk mejān kajjik eo ad indeeo jenaaj kōnaan im jerbal ñan mwil ko remenin aikuj ñan erom juōn armej indeeo. Ñan waanjoñak, armej ro indeeo rej mełokłok aolep men ko raar kōm̄mani rebōd ɳae er. Rej likūt jeram̄jan eo an ro jet im̄aer make. Im rej iakwe aolep ajri ro nejin Anij. Elaññe menin āinwōt epen—im em̄ool ejjab pidodo ñan jabdewōt iaad—innām jej aikuj jino kōn juōn kōnaan ñan kain mwil kein, im kūr ioon ad Jemed Ilañ eo ej iakwe ñan jipañ kōn eñjake ko ad. Bok in Mormon ej katakin kōj bwe jej aikuj “jar ñan Jemād kōn aolep kajoor in bōro, bwe [jān] maroñ obrak kōn iakwe eo An, eo Eaar lełok ioon aolep ro rej ri kałoor ro an rem̄ool an Nejin, Jisōs Kraist” (Moronai 7:48).

Ij kōjemłok kōn waanjoñak eo ăliktata kōn juōn kōnaan me ej aikuj ɬaptata ñan aolep em̄maan im kōrā ro—ro rej m̄are kiiō im ro me rejjab. Aolep rej aikuj kōnaan im m̄ool in jerbal ñan kejparok juōn m̄are ñan indeeo. Ro me em̄oj aer kōm̄mane m̄are ilo tampeł ko aer rej aikuj kōm̄mane aolep ijo remaroñe ñan dāpij wōt. Ro me rejjañin rej aikuj kōnaan m̄are ilo tampeł im kōm̄mane bwe en kōttōpar eo im̄aan tata eo ñan kōm̄mane. Jodikdik ro im rim̄man ded ro ejjełok pāleer rej aikuj jum̄ae men eo ejimwe ilo kien bōtaab ebōd me ej kakkure aorōk eo an m̄are im neji.⁷

Em̄maan ro ejjełok pāleer, jouj lōmṇak kōn kōttōpar eo ilo leta eo kar je jān juōn jejtōr ejjełok pāleen.. Eaar kajjitōk kōn “leddik ro rejimwe nejin Anij me rej lukkuun pukōt juōn mōttaer eo erreo, aaet em̄maan ro āinwōt repilo im bok eļaññe ak jaab eddo eo aer ñan pukōt leddik ro raiboojoj, kālet nejin Jemedwōj Ilañ im mōttāik er im mōnōñō ñan kōm̄man im kejparok bujen ko rekwojarjar ilo mweo imōn Irooj.” Eaar kiili: “Elōñ em̄maan in LDS ro ejjełok pāleer ijin me rej mōnōñō in diwōjłok im mōnōñō, im bwebwenato im limo ippān doon, bōtaab alikkar ejjełok aer kōnaan ñan kōm̄man jabdewōt kain kalim̄mur ñan juōn kōrā.”⁸

Ijełā bwe jet likao ro etōr jān joñan aer kōnaan kappok renaaj kōnaan bwe in kobaik bwe ewōr jet jiroñ ro me rej kōnaan juōn māre eo erreo im ajri ro repād ilał tata ilo kōnaan ko aer kōn jerbal eo aer ak men ko jet an mour in. Jimor em̄maan im kōrā ro rej aikuj kōnaan ko rejimwe me renaaj tōl er ñan mour indeeo.

Jen kememej bwe kōnaan ko rej ba kōttōpar ko ad, kōttōpar ko rej lōme kālōt ko ad, im kālōt ko ad rej kwałok mākūtküt eo ad. Ilo kakobaba, ej ad jerbal im ad kōnaan me ej kōm̄man bwe jān erom juōn men, meñe juōn mōttā eo em̄ool, juōn rūkaki ekapeel, ak juōn eo me ekarbōb ñan mour indeeo.

Ij kam̄ool kōn Jisōs Kraist, eo ej iakwe, eo katak ko an, im pinmuur eo an eaar kōm̄man bwe en pidodo aolep men. Ij jar bwe ilōñ in aolep men jenaaj kōnaan erom āinwōt E bwe juon raan jemaroñ bar rool ñan imaan Mejān ñan bōk tallep in lañlōñ eo An Ilo etan Jisōs Kraist, amen.
