Jej jerbal ñan ro mōttad kōnke eñin ej ta eo jej tōmak Anij ej kōnaan bwe jān kōm̄māne.

Jej mour ilo iien ko renana me elōñ rej tōmak ejjełok ad lokjak ñan Anij im bwe ejjełok an kajjojo jerbal ak eddo ñan kōj make ak ro jet. Elōñ rej kamōñōñōik er make, likūt er im̄aan, im rej iakwe menin kabuñbūruwer elap lōk jān aer iōkwe wānōk. Rejjab tōmak rej rilale ro jatier. Ilo Kabuñ in, mekarta, jej tōmak bwe jerbal kein rej juōn lōke ekwojarjar.

Juōn kumi in ritōl an ri Ju ro elap aer buñbuñ im Rikaki ro raar lotok mōko an Kabuñ in ilo Salt Lake in ekoba Welfare Square eo, Humanitarian Center eo, Family History Center eo im pell̄lok eo an Oquirrh Mountain Temple eo. Ilo jemł̄okin lotok eo aer juōn iaan men ko Rikaki in ebuñbuñ ilo Amedka eaar kwałok eñjaake ko an kōn ta eo ej kab mōj an loe im eñjaake.

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Eaar kwałok katak ko jān ri lōm̄nak in ri Ju ro kar likūt ilo Talmud<sup>2</sup> im kalikar bwe ewōr ruo wūn ko elap aer oktag armej rej ekkeijel ilo jerbal ko an jouj im meanwōd. Jet rej lołok armej ro renañinmej, jipañ rijeramōl, im jerbal ñan ro jet kōnke rej lōm̄nak ej juōn men ejim̄we ñan kōm̄māne im ro jet renaaj bar kōrool lōk im kōm̄māne ejja āinwōt ñan er ñe rej pād ilo aikuj. Eaar kōmeleleik bwe ej juōn men em̄man, kalōk jukukinped ko, im aikuj in kile ej juōn wun em̄man, juōn em̄makūt eutieej ej ñe jej jerbal ñan ro jet kōnke ej ta eo jej tōmak Anij ekōnaan bwe jān kōm̄māne.

Eaar kwałok bwe āinwōt juōn tōbrak in lotok eo an ej tōmak Armej ro Rekwojarjar ilo Raan Kein Ālikata rej jino jerbal in welfare im humanitarian ko im jerbal in lōm̄qor ilo tampeł ko ad ilo laajrak eo ñan kōm̄māne ta eo jej tōmak Anij ekōnaan bwe jān kōm̄māne.

Enjake kōn eddo in , eo epād ie kien eo jinoiñ tata elap ñan iakwe Anij, emōj kōmeleleik jān jet āinwōt “pokake ta eo ejjełok juōn emaroñ kiel kōj ñan kōm̄māne.”<sup>3</sup> Jej kajieoñ in kōm̄man ta eo ejim̄we kōnke dej kōnaan kamōñōñōik Jemed ilo Lañ im ejjab kōnke jet rej kiel kōj ñan pokake.

Pata eo ilo lañ kar kōm̄māne ālkin an Satan bōk mantak juōn karōk me enaaj kar kiel aolep kajjojo ñan pokake karōk eo An kar jab bōke. Āinwōt juōn tōbrak ewōr ad anemkwōj in kālet ilo mour in im anemkwōj eo ñan kālet iał eo ad ilo mour in. Bōtaab dej barāinwōt eddo ñan anemkwōj in kālet eo. Irooj eaar ba jenaaj “eddo kōn jerawiwi ko (ad) make ilo raan in ekajet eo.”<sup>4</sup> Pedped ko an eddok in im jerbal elap aorōk in ilo katak eo ad.<sup>5</sup>

Ilo eddo eo an Kabuñ ejjab wōr joñan ñan lōke eo an mour in ak eo kon̄aam̄. Būreejtōn Spencer W. Kimball eaar katakin, “ . . . dej eddo kōn ānbwiniid, lōm̄nak ko, baam̄le ko, im men ko

mweied. Juōn rijerbal eo etiljek ej juōn eo me ej kōjerbal kajoor eo an erreo, kōjparok baamle eo an make, kōjparok ro rijeramōl im riaikuj ro.”<sup>6</sup>

Ilo wōt an lōn eria ko kōn jerbal, emōj aō kālet ñan kōnono kōn ruo. Kein kajuōn ej jerbal eo kōn kōj make im baamle ko ad. Jerbal eo kein karuo ej ñan rijeramōl im riaikuj ro.

Emakijkij an Irooj kōjerbal būrabōl ko eiokłok āne ilo katakin bōk eddo in jerbal. Ke iaar juōn laddik jidikdik ikōn lołok ro jibū im jimmaō ilo meļaaj eo aer ilo jōmjar. Eaar ejjełok dān ej tōq, ejjełok jarom, ak paib in dān. Mekarta, eaar wōr, juōn dān in wōt ej tōq iturin łok juōn em̄ edik ilo meļaaj eo aer. Dān in eaar kōm̄ane juōn nien dān edik, dān erreo me jet kōttan ilo juōn raan ikōn jipañ jibū ekkotak dān in daak ñan m̄weo, kōmat, tutu, im kwałkoł nuknuk. Jibū im jimmaō eaar iakwe dān in mour in im kōm̄an men otjemjełok ñan kōjparoke.

Elōn iiō tok ālik jimmaō eaar ratimjuōnñoul Jimā an iiō ejjab joke ilo bwidej eo an, eaar jab maroñ in kōjparok ak lale. Iarr ettōrlök kake ñan an lale jikin eo me eaar iakwe. Kōtmene eo an elap ilo an lo jikin eo eaar oktak ñan inepata ke eaar kile bwe oror ko me rej kōjparok dān eo emōj aer lukkuun ejjo. Eaar inepata kōn jorrāān eo im pajin eo. Ñan e eaar juōn kakkure an juōn lōke eaar tiljek kake aolepen iien ko eaar jerbal. Eaar eñjake ilo juōn wāween bwe eaar jab kōjparok dān eo eaar kake mour eo me elap meleļe in ñan e.

Ejja āinwōt an dān eo erreo kar pajin ke kar jab kōjparok e, jej mour ilo juōn tōre me wānōk im mour erreo rejjab kōjparoke.<sup>7</sup> Aorōk eo elap an indeeo an kajjojo mour erreo ejjab utiej. Jemed Ilāñ eo ej iakwe eaar kake ñan kōj kōn jipañ ko ñan bōktok jetōb ko an ajri ro Nejin ñan laļin ñan kakurm̄ool tarlep in kōm̄anm̄an ko aer. Eaar katakin kōj bwe mōttan ko ilo ānbwinid ej ejaak mour kāal rej aikuj in kōjparoki, ejja āinwōt an eo aiboojoj ilo meļaaj eo kar aikuj in kōjparok e ñan kōm̄an bwe en dāpij mour. Eñin ej juōn iaan wun ko etke wānōk im kien erreo rej lukkuun aorōk ilo karōk eo an Jemed Ilāñ.

Kōnke eñjake eo an jimma ñan dān eo epaijin, kōkōmanm̄an łok im kōjparok ko raar kōm̄ane eo me eaar kōrooltok dān eo ñan aiboojoj im erreo eo an kar m̄okta.

Āinwōt juōn rijerbal an Irooj Jisōs Kraist ej ad eddo ekwojarjar ñan katakin jabdewōt joñak ko An kōn mour erreo eo me āinwōt wōt juōn ñan aolep ajri ro Nejin. Ñe lōm̄ak ko ad ak makūtküt ko rej jab erreo, jej kakkure joñak ko An. Irooj eo eaar ba, “Ña . . . ijjab maroñ kalimjōk jerawiwi kōn joñan eo edik tata.”<sup>8</sup> Jet rej kajieoñ in kadikłok aer bōk kuñaer.

Jet rej kajioñ ñan kadikłok aer jerbal. Ilo juōn poem̄ jān John Homles juōn rijōkjōk wa eritto ej katakin juōn likao edik kōn wun em̄man. jodikdik eo ej katak bwe ilo jōk juōn wa “. . . wa eo ej aikuj jerak; kojjab maroñ kōmełeļeik ñan lomałq eo.”<sup>9</sup>

Emōj kar lōm̄ake bwe ta eo ej wałok ilo juōn jikin ej pād wōt ilo jikin eo wōt. Em̄man ippa juōn kōkkałe ilo Sevier County, Utah me ej ba: “Ta eo ej wałok ilo Sevier County . . . kwōj maroñ kwałok ñan ro mōttam!!!” Ñe jej kile bwe jej lokjak ñan Anij, jej lo ewi joñan jajełokjeñ an lōm̄ak waan emaroñ erom̄. Ro me rej lōm̄ak kajidede rej kakememej kōj kōn ajri ro reddik me rej pinej mejeer im kwałok bwe elāññe repan lo kōj, jepan lo er. Imaroñ ke kwałok bwe elāññe jej

lōmṇak in leļq̄k juōn lōq̄k kōn ad makūtkūt ñan RiLōmq̄r eo, jenaaj kile meram in m̄ool eo kōn lōmṇak kajidede ko ad.

Jej ekkōl bwe ewōr ro me rej pād ilo jōkjōk eo me ejjab jokkun wōt juōn ilo joñak eo an mour erreo eo ekwojarjar. Jouj im meļeļe bwe kōn pinmuur eo an RiLōmq̄r eo aolep remaroñ ukweļq̄k im bar rool āinwōt dān eo ñan juōn jōkjōk eo erreo im em̄man. Epen ñan ukweļq̄k; ej aikuj in kōn juōn bōrō erup im jetōb ettā.<sup>10</sup> Ak ñe buñtōn ko ñan ukweļq̄k rej jimwe, naan ko kar kōnono kaki jān rikanaan Alma ñan leo nejin, Corianton, eo eaar koba lōq̄k ilo jerawiwi ko an mour erreo, rej jejet: “Im kiiō, nejū ḡaaan, ikōñaan bwe kwōn kōtlōq̄k bwe men kein rejjab bar kainepataik eok, im kōtlōq̄k bwe jerawiwi ko am̄ ren kainepataik eok, kōn inepata eo enaaj bōk laļļōk eok ñan ukweļq̄k.”<sup>11</sup> RiLōmq̄r eo eaar ba, bwe e eo eaar ukweļq̄k jān jerawiwi ko an ej melōkłōke, im Irooj eo ejjab bar kememeji.<sup>12</sup>

Kōn kautiej eo ñan jerbal ko ad ñan baamle ko ko ad, jet em̄oj kar katakin bwe ñe jej kwaļq̄k ñan RiLōmq̄r, im Ej kajjitōk ippād ñan leļq̄k lōq̄k in eddo ko ad, kajjitōk ko ruo raorōk enaaj iokłōk baamle ko ad. Eo m̄uktata enaaj kōn kadkad eo ad ippān baamle ko ad ippān ro ippād im karuo enaaj kōn kajjojo iaan ajri ro nejid.<sup>13</sup>

Epidodo ñan kapok menin aorōk ko ad,, epidodo ñan bukōj kōttōpar ko ad. Ewōr juōn ad eddo ñan iniwijet e ine em̄man eo im ājmour eo an ro nejid. Mekarta, jet jemen im jinen rej eļļā jān kōttōpar eo ioon jeram̄man ko an mour in im kein jerbal ko. Jet elāp aer jeniknik ilo kakkōt ko aer ñan katulōq̄k ajri ro nejier ilo gospel eo an Jisōs Kraist.<sup>14</sup> Kememej bwe wōr jeļā kōn kabuñ ilo m̄oko ej aorōk in wōt āinwōt bōktok mōñā, nuknuk, im jikin kōppād. Ro jinen im jemen rej maroñ barāinwōt jipañ ajri ro loe im kōlapłōk tōlan ko aer. Jej eddo ñan tōlan ko em̄oj kar ad būki. Ajri ro me rejjab katakin bwe rej eddo ñan iin eo aer im tōlan ko rej łapłōk ñan menin bwebwe im jab wānōk me rej pād aolep jikin ilo laļ in.<sup>15</sup> Keañ eo an baamle ej kakkōl bwe kajjojo “ak ro rej likjab in kōtōprak eddo ko an baamle eo naaj juōn raan ḡaruwier im̄aan Anij.”<sup>16</sup>

Jerbal eo kein karuo ej kōjparok rijeramōl im riaikuj ro, eo ej jerbal ñan enañin aolepedwōj ilo juōn iien ak bar juōn iien. Kakkōl eo an Irooj bwe rej rijerbal ro ñan rijeramōl im riaikuj repād ie jet iaan kajin ko rekajoor tata ilo aolep eoon ko: Eļaññe jabdewōt enaaj bōk kōjeram̄man ko me Irooj eaar kōm̄mani im jab ajije mōttan eo an ñan rijeramōl im riaikuj eo, enaaj kotak mejān ilo hell ippān rijerawiwi eo, mour eñtaan.<sup>17</sup> Jej lokjak āinwōt rijerbal ro ioon kōjeram̄man ko an laļ in, me Irooj em̄oj an kōpooji.

Ritōl ro an ri Ju ro me iaar kōnono kaki im̄aan lōq̄k raar lukkuun bwilōñ kōn pedped eo an jitłōk im kōllāik jortak in jitłōk eo em̄ool. Raar lōmṇak eaar juōn men ekabwilōnlōñ bwe ro uwaan Kabuñ in aolepen lalin rej maroñ jitłōk allōñ otemjeļq̄k innem kōm̄mane ilo kōñaan eo aer make jortak ko ñan jeram̄man eo an ro me rej pā ilo aikuj.

Ke Rabbis eo ekar loļq̄k Welfare Square eo raar eñjaake ñan katak bwe meñe ilo iien ko reppen an jeram̄man ko ro uwaad, rekar inepata kōn abañ ko rej eñjaaki jān elōñ, ej wōnmaanłōk wōt ñan leļq̄k tiriamo ñan jipañ rijeramōl im riaikuj ro.

Imaroñ kememej ke kar kūr eō āinwōt juōn bisop eo iaar bōk jikin, Bisop Russell Johnson, eaar

kakkōl eō ij aikuj in mejmej karuo kōn ta eo iaar kajjitōk ippān ro uwaan ñan kōm̄māne. Eaar ba, “Jet renaaj uwaak ñan aolep kajjitōk ko meñe ilo iien apañ.” Eaar ba kōn juōn kōrā emej rejetan rittqon ralitōkñoul jim̄a eo eaar kaoik jimor leo ippān im laddik eo nejin ilo aolepen iien nañinmej ko mokta jān aer kar mej. Bisop Johnson eaar ba bwe meñe eaar jabwe menin jeram̄man ko, ekōn aolep iien kajioñ in uwaak.

Juōn Jādede, bar juōn jejtōr eaar kūr eō im ba “Bisop, mōkaj tok, lqm̄oren Sarah!” Jejtōr in eaar kwal̄q bwe Sarah eo 80 an iiō eaar pād ilōñ tata in juōn jikiniuwe ej karreoir tāāñ ko an ro iturin. Jejtōr eaar kwōr bwe Sarah emaroñ kar wōtl̄q im kōñaan bwe bisop eo en kabōjrake.

Ijjab ba bwe jabbewōt emaroñ ak aikuj anōk Sarah. Jet rej eñjake bwe rebōd kōnke rejjab maroñ kake aolep aikuj ko ilo iien eo emōkaj tata. Ij iakwe quote eo El̄tōr Neal A. Maxwell ekōn kōjerbale jān Anne Morrow Lindbergh, “Ijjab maroñ ilo mour e aō jipañ aolep armej ro me ij lukkuun kōñaan jipañ.”<sup>18</sup> Kiiñ Benjamin eaar katakin, “Lale bwe aolep men kein rej kōm̄mān ilo lolātāt im kwoñ; bwe e jab aikuj bwe juōn armej en ettōr mōkaj l̄qk jān kajoor eo an.”<sup>19</sup> Bōtaab eaar kobaik tok bwe jej aikuj in tiljek.

Būruwō elem̄ñōñō ilo aō kalimjōk rikwojarjar ro ilo Kabuñ in rej kōm̄māne aolep men remaroñ kōm̄māne ñan kōm̄māni jerbal ko āinwōt an Kraist jabbewōt jikin ewōr juōn aikuj ie. Kōnke menin lel̄q ko an ro uwaan, Kabun in emaroñ ikōñ im mōkaj ilo jab kōmejāje ñan uwaaki aikuj ko aolepen laj in.<sup>20</sup> Kabuñ in emōj an jipañ l̄qk jorrāān ko rell̄ap ilo Philippines, Wōden Bwil ko, im Indonesia.

Iiō eo l̄qk ro uwaad raar eqroñ Hurricane Gastav. Kabuñ in eaar jerbal ippān juōn doulul in humanitarian kar tōl jān Martin Luther King, III. Mr. King eaar lotok Salt Lake City im ba: “Iaar itok ñan kwal̄q aō kam̄oolol ñan Kabuñ in kōn humanitarian jipañ ko aer, bōtaab emōkaj aō ekkatak bwe m̄ool eo kōn wōn kom̄ eaar l̄ap an l̄ap im m̄wilał. Ikōtaan Humanitarian Center eo, Welfare Square eo im iien kaloojoj an tamepl̄ eo, ej kiiō wōr juōn aō kam̄oolol el̄ap kōn etke komij kōm̄māne ta eo komij kōm̄māne.”

Ilo aolepen jerbal in jipañ ko ad jej l̄oor Jisōs Kraist. Jej kajioñ in l̄oor ta eo Eaar kajjitōk ippād ñan kōm̄māne, jimor ilo katak ko An im waanjoñak ko An. Kōn aolepen būruwōd jej kwal̄q ad kam̄oolol ñan ro uwaan Kabuñ in kōn menin lel̄q ko aer rem̄ool im jerbal eo āinwōt an Kraist.

Aiseia, ej kōnono kōn jitl̄q im najrik ro rej kole im kanuknuk ro rekālwaan, im kajin eo kar kalim̄mur kake, “Innām kwō naaj kūr im Jeova enaaj uwaak.”<sup>21</sup> Aiseia ej wōnmaanl̄qk wōt, “Im el̄aññekwōj lel̄q ñan ro ri kwōle im kam̄at eo emōj kaeñtaan e; . . . Jeova enaaj tōl eok iien otomez, . . . im kwōnaaj āinwōt juon . . . wōtdikdik e, ān ko an re jāmin roj . . . [Im] kwōnaaj lel̄oñl̄qk l̄oñtak ko an elōñ epepen ko.”<sup>22</sup>

Kōjatdikdi eo aō ej bwe kajjojo iaad enaaj bar etale kajjojo armej im āinwōt baam̄le jerbal ko me ewōr ad eddo im lokjak kaki. Ij jar bwe jenaaj kōm̄māne bwe jejeñā jej lukkuun lokjak ñan Anij im bwe ilo mour in jenaaj ekkejel l̄qk ñan men eo raar jab kiel kōj ñan pokake.

Ilo ad l̄oor keañ in, ijeñā jenaaj jejjet ñan kalim̄mur eo an Irooj, “Im jabbewōt eo elo juōn tiljek,

juōn jimwe, im juōn rijerbla emeletlet enaaj deļoñ ilo lemōñōñō an Irooj eo an, im enaaj bōk mour indeeo.”<sup>23</sup>

Ij kwałok aō kamool kōn mool in ekwojarjar ilo etan Jisōs Kraist, amen.
