

members to respond to the following question: "What do you do if you find yourself in what you think is a boring sacrament meeting?" Discuss their different responses. Share President Kimball's answer to the same question. Challenge family members to follow his example of being an active learner and receiving by the Spirit (see D&C 50:13–22) when they attend Church meetings.

"The Opposite of Fear," p. F14: Read the first four paragraphs of Tricia's story to illustrate why she is afraid. Ask, "What can we do to overcome our fears?" Finish reading Tricia's story, and testify of the power of prayer and hymns in overcoming our fears.
