Fudgy Brownies

You can share these brownies with people you love, like Sister Antonietti did! Be sure to get an adult's help.

1/2 cup melted butter

2 eggs

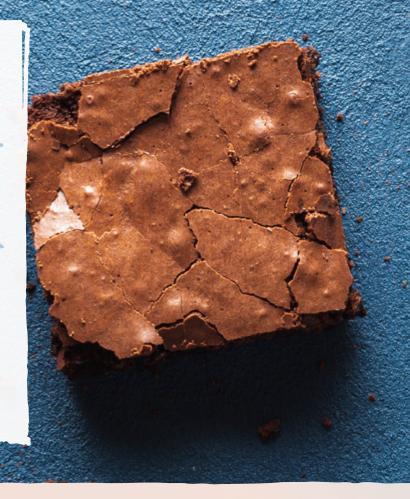
1/2 cup cocoa powder

1 teaspoon vanilla

1/2 cup flour 1 1/4 cups sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt

- Mix together the melted butter, cocoa, and sugar for about one minute. Then mix in the eggs and vanilla.
- 2. Stir in the flour and salt. Pour the batter into a greased 8x8-inch (20x20-cm) square pan.
- 3. Bake for 20-25 minutes at 350°F (180°C).
- 4. Allow brownies to cool before slicing.
