When he was the prophet, he went to the temple each week. He always did temple work for an ancestor.


You too can learn to love the temple now. Some of you have pictures of temples in your homes. Many of you can visit temple grounds. Some may even be able to attend open houses when temples are built.


Because of the temple, we have the hope that we can live with our families forever.





Thank you, Heavenly Father, she prayed. Thank you for cheering me on. ●



Being worthy means trying to do what the Lord would like us to do. Even at your young age, you can prepare to enter the temple someday.








Temple Recommend Questions

- Do you have faith in Heavenly Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Ghost?
- Do you have a testimony of Jesus Christ's Atonement and in the Restoration of His Church?
- Do you sustain (support) your Church leaders (like the prophet, the apostles, and your bishop)?
- Do you strive (try hard) to keep your mind and body clean and pure?
- Do you follow the teachings of the Church of Jesus Christ in how you treat others?
- Do you strive to keep the Sabbath holy?
- Do you strive to be honest?
- Do you pay a full 10-percent tithing?
- Do you understand and obey the Word of Wisdom?
- Are there any serious sins you need to repent of?
- Do you feel you are worthy to enter the Lord's house?








Jesus Christ Named His Church


Jesus Christ told Joseph Smith what to name the Church. He said it would be called "The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints."






The words *Jesus Christ* are the most important part of the Church's name. Since it is Jesus Christ's Church, it is named after Him.


