Learning to See Sexuality as a Sacred Gift

s members of the Church, we're taught that sexual intimacy within marriage is a wonderful part of the gospel plan. It can be a sacred, beautiful, joyful part of our lives that leads to greater unity with our spouse and God. But what about sexual feelings before marriage? Our sexual natures don't begin at marriage—God has given us sexual feelings that are a healthy and important aspect of being human. So how can we learn to see sexuality as a sacred gift, an essential part of our God-given nature? And how can we manage our sexuality in harmony with its ultimate purpose in God's eternal plan?

With these questions in mind, we've put together this month's section to help you increase your understanding of God's view of appropriate sexuality. We hope that with this positive view, you will feel more determined to live the law of chastity, **find purpose and hope** in your individual circumstances, be prepared to have a strong, fulfilling marriage, and invite the Savior's peace into your life.
