“[Speak] the truth in love” (Ephesians 4:15).

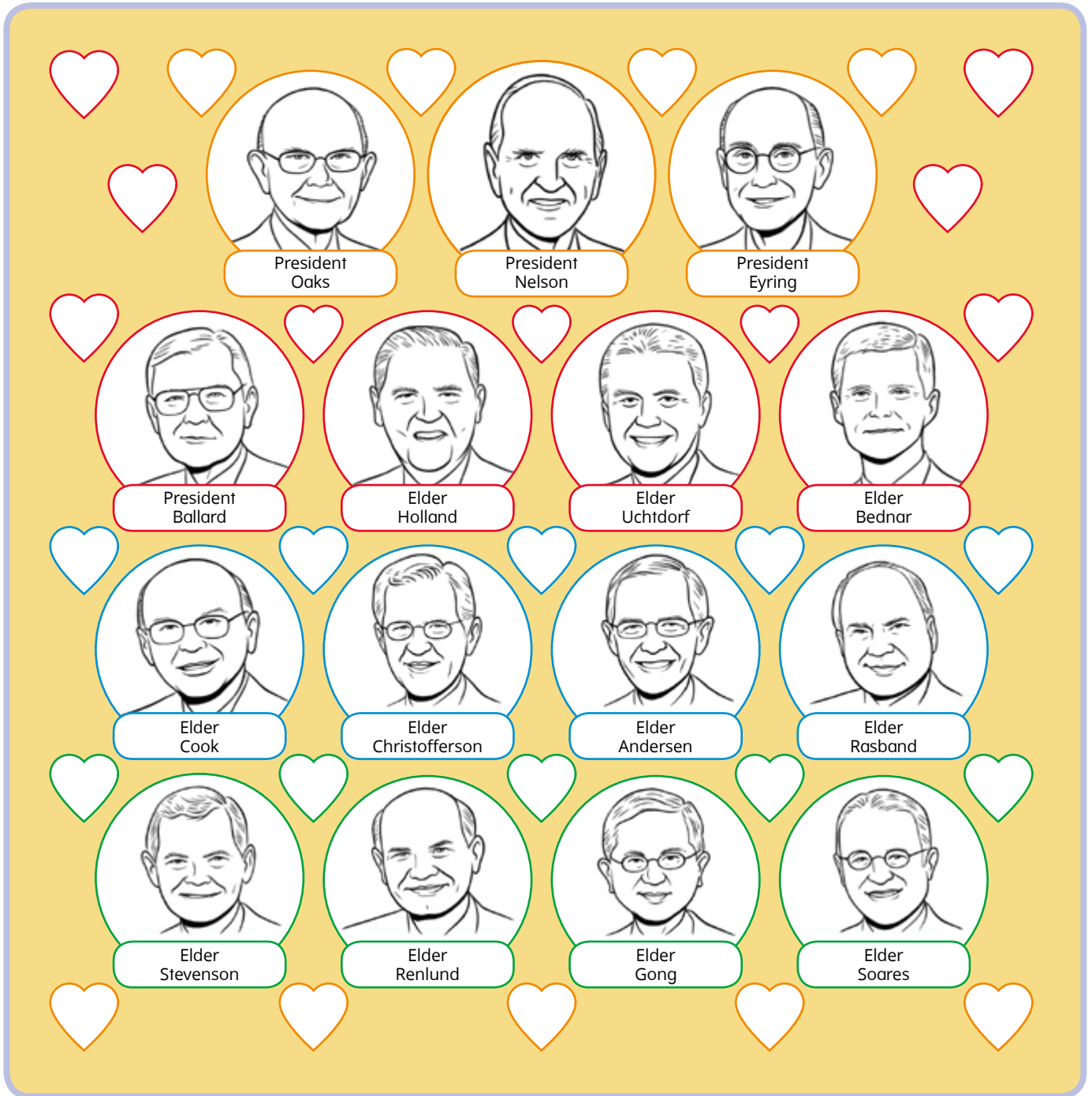
Our Savior’s commandment to love one another as He loves us is probably our greatest challenge. I pray that we can try to show love in all we do. ●
