

GENERAL PRIESTHOOD SESSION

The Powers of the Priesthood

"THE MELCHIZEDEK PRIESTHOOD is the divine authority God has delegated to accomplish His work 'to bring to pass the . . . eternal life of man' (Moses 1:39). . . . It is sacred and powerful beyond our powers to describe. . . .

"The Melchizedek Priesthood is not a status or a label. It is a divine power held in trust to use for the benefit of God's work for His children. We should always remember that men who hold the priesthood are not 'the priesthood.' . . .

"The most important principle for all priesthood holders is the principle taught by the Book of Mormon prophet Jacob. After he and his brother Joseph were consecrated priests and teachers of the people, he declared, 'And we did magnify our office unto the Lord, taking upon us the responsibility, answering the sins of the people upon our own heads if we did not teach them the word of God with all diligence' (Jacob 1:19).

"Brethren, our responsibilities as holders of the priesthood are serious matters. Other organizations can be satisfied with worldly standards of performance in delivering their

Small and Simple Things

"WE ARE TAUGHT many small and simple things in the gospel of Jesus Christ. We need to be reminded that in total and over a significant period of time, these seemingly small things bring to pass great things. . . .

"Consider . . . scripture study. . . . Or consider . . . personal prayers and . . . kneeling family prayers. . . . Consider attendance at seminary. . . . Though each of these practices may seem to be small and simple, over time they result in powerful spiritual uplift and growth. . . .

"... Our own inspired self-evaluations can help us see how we have fallen short and how we can do better. . . .

"To protect against the cumulative negative effects that are destructive to our spiritual progress, we need to follow the spiritual pattern of small and simple things."

". . . If the Lord Himself were to ask you to help one of His sons or daughters-which He has done through His servants-would you do it? And if you did, would you act as His agent, 'on the Lord's errand,' relying on His promised help? . . .

"... President Harold B. Lee gave this promise: . . . 'Vested in the power of the priesthood, which is the power of Almighty God, is the power to perform miracles if the Lord wills it so, but in order for us to use that priesthood, we must be worthy to exercise it. A failure to understand this principle is a failure to receive the blessings of holding that great priesthood' [Teachings of Presidents of the Church: Harold B. Lee (2000), 97]."


Inspired Ministering

"STRENGTHENED QUORUMS . . .

[require] at least two things to be successful in the Lord's intent to have His Saints care for each other in the way He cares for them. They succeed when the Saints feel the love of Christ for each other above their self-interest. The scriptures call it "charity ... the pure love of Christ" (Moroni 7:47). And they succeed when the Holy Ghost guides the caregiver to know what the Lord knows is best for the person whom He is trying to help. . . .

"... We receive the Holy Spirit best when we are focused on serving others. This is why we have the priesthood responsibility to serve for the Savior. When we are engaged in service to others, we think less about ourselves, and the Holy Ghost can more readily come to us and help us in our lifelong quest to have the gift of charity bestowed upon us."





SUNDAY MORNING SESSION

His Spirit to Be with You

"MY HOPE today is to increase your desire and your ability to receive the Holy Ghost. Remember, He is the third member of the Godhead. The Father and the Son are resurrected beings. The Holy Ghost is a person of spirit. (See D&C 130:22.) It is your choice whether to receive Him and welcome Him into your heart and mind. . . .

"More precious than memory of events is the memory of the Holy Ghost touching our hearts and His continuing affirmation of truth. More precious than seeing with our eyes or remembering words spoken and read is recalling the feelings that accompanied the quiet voice of the Spirit. Rarely I have felt it exactly as the travelers on the road to Emmaus did—as a soft burning in the heart. More often it is a feeling of light and quiet assurance....

- "... Our obligation is to choose to open our hearts to receive the ministration of the Spirit over a lifetime. . . .
- "... Great ministers have qualified for the Holy Ghost as a nearly constant companion. And they have qualified for the gift of charity, which is the pure love of Christ. . . .

"I bear my personal witness that the Father is at this moment aware of you, your feelings, and the spiritual and temporal needs of everyone around you. I bear testimony that the Father and the Son are sending the Holy Ghost to all who have that gift, ask for that blessing, and seek to be worthy of it."



How can I be guided by the Holy Ghost?

ANSWER:

- · Be obedient, commit to act, seek guidance in good times and bad (see Elder Larry Y. Wilson).
- Be humble, pray with faith, obey exactly, pray to know the needs and hearts of others (see President Henry B. Eyring, "His Spirit to Be with You").
- Seek personal revelation on questions, know that God wants to speak to you, be pure, be obedient, study the scriptures daily, do temple and family history work regularly, be patient (see President Russell M. Nelson, "Revelation for the Church, Revelation for Our Lives").

Open its pages and learn that God does "all things for [our] welfare and happiness" [Helaman 12:2]; that He is "merciful and gracious, slow to anger, long-suffering and full of goodness" [Lectures on Faith (1985), 42.]; and that "all are alike unto [Him]" [2 Nephi 26:33]. When you feel hurt, lost, scared, upset, sad, hungry, or hopelessly abandoned in life's extremities—open the Book of Mormon, and you will come to know that "[God] will never desert us. He never has, and He never will. He cannot do it. It is not His character [to do so]."
















1. Embark

Models for this photo came dressed in their Sunday best, only to be asked to roll up their sleeves and be careful passing, hand to hand, gauze that had been drenched in used motor oil mixed with oatmeal.

4. Stav on Your Toes

The photographer spent hours drilling holes and driving nails into boards. Then, leaning on parallel bars unseen in the photo, the dancer went on pointe. Boards were slid next to her feet, and the photo was taken.

5. You Can Conquer **Giant Problems**

Each person in the photo was raised up in a harness and photographed, then the photos were digitally blended to create this image with a message about family members helping each other to weather the storms of life.





everyone because she was ashamed. She later told me that she didn't want others to pity her or her situation. But I didn't pity her—I just felt compassion.

That first day, I lay on my bed after school, my face buried in a pillow. I was emotionally exhausted but too anxious to sleep. My world was in chaos. I felt like I was in the middle of a storm, and so many thoughts and feelings whirled in the wind. I felt confused, lonely, and, most of all, so powerless to help.

How Could I Help?

What could I do or say to help her? How could we as friends pull together and lend our support? I couldn't find any sort of solution to comfort my friends or myself. I prayed for inspiration but felt like my prayers just weren't getting answered.

But the next week I had an epiphany. I was sitting in my early-morning seminary class when my teacher reminded us of the First Vision and how Joseph Smith asked Heavenly Father directly for help with his difficulties and concerns. My teacher then said, "If we seek out the Father and ask Him, He will answer us. We will never be alone."

I realized that in my sadness, I had closed my heart off to my Heavenly Father. Even though I was trying to pray often, it wasn't enough—I still had too much fear to find peace. I knew that He understood exactly how I felt and that He could help me. But I needed to open myself up to Him and truly trust that He could do it—I needed to exercise faith.

So I did. Over time, as I continued to pray and read my scriptures, striving to let the Savior take my burdens, I came to understand that eventually my friend's depression would end. Despite the fact that the external chaos continued, I felt calm, balanced, in harmony. My mother kept encouraging me to seek out peace, saying, "Your friend will be OK and so will you. Stay strong in the gospel, and it will all work out."

Supporting My Friend

When Fernanda finally came back to school, I was able to provide strong support for her, but only because I had sought out and found peace through Jesus Christ myself. I tried my best to be a good listener, to be positive, and to share the gospel. I felt confident when I explained the plan of happiness and when I told her that our Father wants us to find joy, despite our challenges. It may take time, but it is possible for every one of His children.

There have been many situations in my life in which I have felt anguish and sadness, but because of the gospel I always remember where I come from. I know that I am a daughter of God and that He has a plan for me—and for Fernanda. We all walk distinct paths, but each is for our good because He loves us. Each path, each trial, has a purpose. And if we can find peace in those trials, we can share the peace we gain with others. NE



DEPRESSION: HOW TO RESPOND

If you have a friend who suffers from depression, make a special effort to listen to and be supportive of them in their trials. They need your love. Ask your parents for advice. Make sure your friend's parents are aware (even if your friend doesn't want them to be) and ask for their advice on how you can help. If the situation is severe (like hurting themselves), and their parents are aware but doing nothing, tell a schoolteacher, school counselor, or Church leader.

The whole year, I battled back and forth for first place with a boy named Spencer. One week I would be in first place, and the next week he would be. At the last rodeo of the year, Spencer pulled ahead of mebut just barely. To win, all I had to do was ride a little bit better. I came out of the chute and was riding great. Then, right before the buzzer, I got bucked off. That was it. Spencer was the new champion. After the rodeo, I noticed him praying behind the chutes where he thought no one could see him. He was my greatest rival, but I wanted to be nice, so I went over and congratulated him, and he told me he appreciated the kind words. We started talking about our dreams of being world champions. I got to thinking he was a pretty cool guy. From that day on, we were best friends, and every summer after that, we always did things together. 34 New Era

However, during my freshman and sophomore years of high school, I started hanging out with the wrong crowd. My new friends and I thought it was better to drink and fight instead of going to school, and I failed a lot of my classes. At the end of my sophomore year, the high school principal told me it would be best if I didn't come back to school.

I called Spencer and told him what had happened. Without missing a beat, he said to come to his high school. He lived in a town about 35 miles away. After talking it over with my mom, I accepted Spencer's family's invitation and moved in with them. That turned out great, because I was able to make up all the classes I had failed and graduate on time. And we were able to continue doing rodeo!

Spencer's family were also members of the Church. That made me nervous, because I had been taught my whole life that if I walked inside an LDS church, I would see fire and go straight to hell.

But Spencer and other Mormons were really nice to me, and I felt comfortable around them. So even though I was pretty scared of the Church, I went to church with them a few times and met a lot of other good people.

Their kindness helped soften my heart.

One of my new friends, Rick, was a member of the Church too. The night before he left on his mission, I told him I was feeling frustrated. I couldn't go into the military, I didn't want to go to college, and I didn't know what to do. He looked right at me and said, "You should go on a mission like me."

That statement hit me like a ton of bricks. I said, "All right, I'll go on a mission."

He laughed and said, "Well, you have to be a member of the Church first."

I met with the missionaries with Spencer's

family after Rick left for his mission. Six weeks later, Spencer baptized me. I was almost 19 years old.

Still, things weren't perfect after that. Most of my family was not happy that I joined the Church. My dad even offered me a brand-new pickup truck if I would just forget about it. But my brother Roger supported me. When I told him I wanted to serve a mission, he told me to give it 110%. Whether I was serving a mission

or not, he told me to always do my best.

I tried to prepare the best I could by studying the scriptures, praying, and going to a mission prep class. While I was on my mission in North Carolina, I lost myself in the work and did my best to follow Roger's advice to give it 110%.

Ten years later, I lost my dad to cancer. Even though he and I had hard times, I love him so much. As I leaned down to hug him and say "I love you" one last time, he said something I will never forget. He told me he was proud of me and that he was glad I served a mission. Two years later, Spencer got to baptize me for my father in the temple.

My family may not have approved of my joining the Church, but because of their unfailing love and the example of my friends and their families, I was able to serve a mission, be married in the temple, and help my dad after he passed on. I am grateful to be a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. NE



When your best efforts don't immediately work out the way you hoped ... you're in good company.

ave you ever given your absolute best to accomplish something but still come up short? You aren't alone! The scriptures are full of inspiring people who had to learn the hard way that life is rarely a smooth ride.

At the same time, it's also worth pushing past the speed bumps. Here are a few examples from the scriptures worth considering whenever you need a little encouragement.



The stakes couldn't have been much higher. The fate of an entire nation was on the line. If Nephi and his brothers didn't bring back the brass plates from Laban, an entire "nation [would] dwindle and perish in unbelief" (1 Nephi 4:13).

A whole nation! All of those people depending on one errand. You might think that with such high stakes, mighty miracles would open up a clear path to success. As you may have read, the way forward turned out to be anything but clear.

Despite their best efforts, Nephi and his brothers failed not once but twice. The second failure was particularly devastating. They lost all their worldly riches and were nearly killed by Laban's servants. After the second attempt, Nephi and Sam were beaten by their older brothers (see 1 Nephi 3:22-28).

Soon after, Nephi was ready to make a third attempt. This time he went alone, "led by the Spirit, not knowing beforehand the things which [he] should do" (1 Nephi 4:6). Only on this third attempt, while listening closely to the Spirit, did he succeed.



When Samuel the Lamanite came to Zarahemla, he had a message from God to share. And he worked hard at doing so. The scriptures say he preached repentance for "many days" to the wicked Nephites (Helaman 13:2). And how did the people respond? They ran him out of town. Samuel had done all he could, and was "about to return to his own land" when the Spirit told him to try again (Helaman 13:2-3).

He didn't exactly receive a warm welcome. The citizens refused to let Samuel back into the city (see Helaman 13:4). Next step, he climbed on the city wall to deliver his message anew. The disbelievers were so determined to stop Samuel that they threw stones and shot arrows at him (see Helaman 16:2).

PETER AND THE ROAD TO FAITH

The New Testament is full of examples of devoted followers of Jesus Christ having to learn as they go. For example, the Apostle Peter walked on water briefly, until doubt crept in and he began to sink (see Matthew 14:28-31).


But Peter's faith didn't waver like that forever. He learned and grew, ultimately performing many miracles in the name of Jesus Christ (see Acts 2:43). One miracle happened after Jesus's Resurrection, when Peter saw a lame beggar outside a temple.

"Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk" (Acts 3:6-7). Peter, the same man who had sunk into the water when his faith faltered, grabbed the hand of the lame beggar with full faith that he'd be able to walk. The man rose, walked, and leaped for joy, praising God (see Acts 3:8).

protection. "Guess what, Mom and Dad? The arrows couldn't hit him!"

The truth is, we have no way of knowing whether Samuel was assured ahead of time that he'd be protected. We know only that he followed the commandment to try again despite the challenges. As a result, many people were converted and baptized (see Helaman 16:1–3).





ARRIS AND THE CHANCE TO TESTIFY

Some people think immediately of the lost 116 manuscript pages whenever they hear the name "Martin Harris." After all, he pressed Joseph Smith time and again to ask God if Martin could show the pages to his family (see D&C 3:12-13). But Martin's story doesn't end there.

Martin repented and continued supporting the Prophet Joseph, including financing the original publication of the Book of Mormon.

President Dallin H. Oaks described that single act as "one of Martin Harris's greatest contributions to the Church, for which he should be honored for all time."1

His story continues. Martin was chosen as one of the three special witnesses of the Book of Mormon. Yet even with this experience (which took place after the 116 pages were lost), Martin had to overcome failure.

To set the scene, Joseph Smith entered the woods with Martin Harris, David Whitmer, and Oliver Cowdery. They were acting on revelation that the time had come for witnesses to see the sacred plates. Each man took turns praying to be shown the plates. Nothing happened. They each prayed again ... still nothing.

Joseph Smith wrote, "Upon this, our second failure, Martin Harris proposed that he should withdraw himself from us, believing, as he expressed himself, that his presence was the cause of our not obtaining what we wished for."2

Sure enough, not long after Martin left, the angel Moroni appeared and revealed the plates to David Whitmer and Oliver Cowdery. But if you read the Testimony of the Three Witnesses, you'll see Martin's name right alongside the other two. How so?

Because Martin didn't give up.

He retreated further into the woods and kept praying. When Joseph found him later, Martin pleaded with Joseph to pray with him again.

This time. Martin's faith was rewarded with the same vision the others had seen. "Tis enough; tis enough; mine eyes have beheld," Martin said.³

Though Martin Harris faded in and out of Church activity in later years (finally fully returning to the Church community at age 87), he never once faded in his testimony of the Book of Mormon nor what he had witnessed in the woods.

JOSEPH OF EGYPT AND THE REDIRECTED LIFE


Few figures in the scriptures are a better example of optimistic persistence through setbacks than Joseph of Egypt. You can read his story in depth in Genesis 37-50. For now, here are a couple highlights.

Seventeen-year-old Joseph tells his older brothers—who already hated him—about a dream he had where one day he'd rule over them (see Genesis 37:5-10). Their punishment of him was swift and brutal. They faked Joseph's death and sold him into slavery.

He then became a favored servant in the house of Potiphar until Potiphar's wife tried to seduce him. When Joseph resisted, she lied about him to her husband. Now in jail for his supposed crimes, Joseph gained the trust of the jailer and was given charge of all the prisoners. Though innocent, he remained in prison for two years until he had a chance to help Pharaoh interpret a dream.

Here, at last, his luck changed ... but at age 30! Some quick math reveals that Joseph spent 13 years (or roughly 43 percent of his life to that point) as a slave or prisoner when he had done nothing wrong. But oh, what happened next as a result of his continued faith and persistence!

Pharaoh was so impressed with Joseph that he made him second in command over all of Egypt. Because of Joseph's position, he was later able to help save many people, including many from other countries—among them his whole family—from starvation.



TRY_{AND} TRY AGAIN

A pattern seems to float to the surface after studying these and other similar scriptural accounts. Plain and simple, many of life's setbacks seem to work out in the long run. Failing once or even multiple times at something often doesn't determine the final outcome, as long as you stay faithful to God and His commandments and keep on trying.

So, keep on trying! The best is yet to come. **NE**




Group Date

"They that are wise and have received the truth, and have taken the Holy Spirit for their guide, and have not been deceived—verily I say unto you, they shall not be hewn down and cast into the fire, but shall abide the day" (D&C 45:57).

"What if the day of His coming were tomorrow? ... What confessions would we make? What practices would we discontinue? What accounts would we settle? What forgivenesses would we extend? What testimonies would we bear?







However, after getting in a car crash two weeks later and receiving a concussion and several injuries on my face, I was miserable.


